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and supports, and plan for a gradual return to school in a coordinated manner. The health and safety guidelines and protocols, as well as program plans for students in Kindergarten – Grade 5; Grade 6-7; and students in Grades 8-12 will be made public and posted on the district website.

There is no doubt that our schools will look and feel different on June 1. We will see fewer students and have smaller classes. Classrooms will be configured differently in order to
